Weather for today doesn't look much better, with the CMH TAF showing winds 230 @ 12 gusting to 20, and visibility 5 miles with light rain showers and the ceiling at 1500 feet. The current plan for today is to get as many short field landings in as possible, and upon completion the final two rounds of Message Drop.
